



The Society holds a list of moorland herd owners and liaises with the breeders who have foals for registration in the autumn. The dates of the moorland gatherings and contact telephone numbers are available from the Secretary from early September onwards. If you wish to attend a gathering then please contact the moorland breeder concerned to ensure that onlookers are aware of vantage points and do not stand in the line of the ponies. Following inspections, the Society is able to advise potential owners which herds have foals and youngstock for sale and again provide details of the herd owners in question.

THE EXMOOR PONY CODE

- **1. Drive slowly** across the commons and at night, use main beam whenever possible.
- 2. When out on Exmoor, please close the gates. Many of the commons are interlinked and stallions and mares moving across commons can affect breeding programmes.
- **3. Please keep your dog under control** when passing the ponies
- 4. Do not feed the ponies or drop litter or food.
- 5. Be aware that both mares and stallions can be protective of their foals in the spring so admire the ponies from a distance.
- If you see an injured or sick pony on Exmoor, then please contact the Exmoor Pony Society (01643 851777)
